NOTE: Majors must pass the university writing requirement for admission to teacher education and take PRAXIS for graduation. A grade of "C" or better in all Professional Education courses, and a GPA of 2.5 is required overall, in ECU coursework, in teaching majors and minors, in emphasis area and in Professional Education. Students enrolled in teacher certification programs at ECU must obtain approval from the Dean of the College of Education prior to enrolling at other institutions for courses to be used in their programs.
